

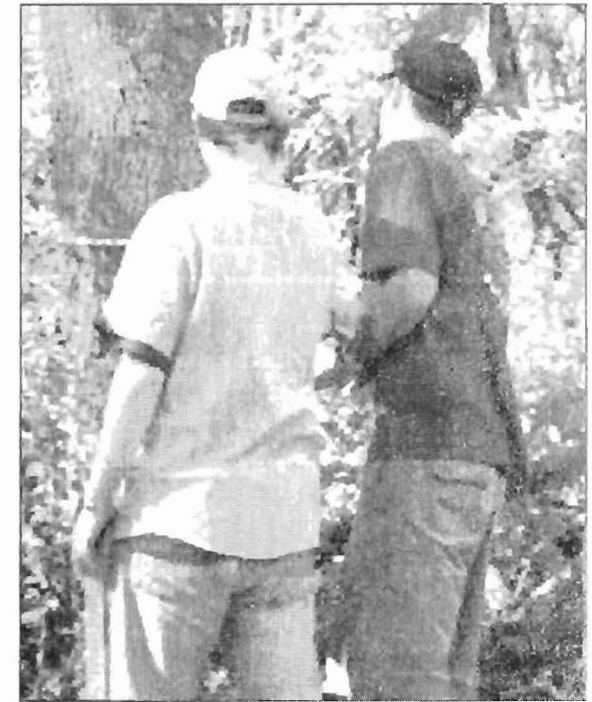
Indeck-Oswego Energy Center to be recognized for supporting envirothon

Indeck-Oswego Energy Center will be recognized, May 2, for 15 years of supporting environmental education in Oswego County. Indeck employees recently made a donation to the 2008 Oswego County Envirothon, an event they have been sponsoring since 1994.

The Envirothon, coordinated by the Oswego County Soil and Water Conservation District, is a hands-on, environmental competition that tests students in the areas of aquatics, current issues, forestry, soil and wildlife. Each county high school is invited to send two teams of five students to the event, at which they work together in their teams to take hands-on exams. "Hands-on" means that the students may match aquatic bird mounts to their preferred habitat, identify trees, study soils in a pit or distinguish animals using skulls and furs.

The 2008 Oswego County Envirothon will be held May 2 at Camp Hollis in Oswego. Teams from seven of the county's nine school districts will be participating in this year's event: Altmar-Parish-Williamstown, Central Square, Fulton, Hannibal, Mexico, Oswego and Pulaski. Following the competition on May 2, there will be an awards ceremony at which Indeck will be recognized for 15 years of sponsorship.
