Indeck Ladysmith BioFuel Center Moves Closer to Commercial Operation

Biomass Pellet Production Facility Produces First Wood Pellets

LADYSMITH, WI – Indeck Energy Services, Inc. (“Indeck Energy”) and Midwest Forest Products Company (“Midwest Forest”), owners of Indeck Ladysmith, LLC, announced today that they have produced their first wood pellets from the Indeck Ladysmith BioFuel Center. Commissioning of the facility’s packaging systems will take place this month. The Indeck Ladysmith BioFuel Center is expected to be in full commercial operation by July 1, 2009.

The Indeck Ladysmith BioFuel Center, located in the City of Ladysmith’s Forest Products Industrial Park, will produce 90,000 tons per year of renewable biomass pellets to serve the residential home heating and the industrial power generation markets. Pellets will be shipped either bagged or in bulk via truck or rail. The opening of the facility has created 23 full-time jobs and will support approximately 100 jobs in the Wisconsin forest industry.

Indeck Energy is a privately held developer, owner and operator of renewable and conventional energy projects. As one of the few remaining privately held independent power producers, it has grown into a full-service energy company that offers biofuels production and electrical generation facilities. The company was established in 1985 and is headquartered in Buffalo Grove, IL.

Midwest Forest is a privately held corporation that is actively involved in pulpwood processing and procurement, chipping, trucking, timber harvesting, and timberland management. Midwest Forest pioneered the concept of portable ring debarking and chipping services where debarking quality is a primary goal. The company was established in 1977 and is headquartered in Hayward, WI.
